MEMBER – A person who is conducting, has conducted, or who is interested in the furtherance of research in any branch of science or in fields related to dental science. Members shall have the full rights and privileges of membership and are eligible to vote and to hold office in the Association.

STUDENT MEMBER – A person who is a student currently enrolled in a recognized academic institution who does not hold an academic appointment and who is interested in dental research. Student members must become Members when eligible or be dropped from membership. Individuals may be classified at the Student level for no more than 8 years. The Student Member shall have all the rights and privileges of membership but shall have no vote.

IADR membership is based on a calendar year (January 1 – December 31). During the months of July and August, you may pay half of the IADR membership annual dues. If you join from September through December, your membership and related items will be activated the following January.

Membership and Publications Refund Policy
