The 2023 AADOCR/CADR Annual Meeting & Exhibition provided dental, oral, and craniofacial health scientists with the opportunity to present, discuss, and critique their latest and most cutting-edge research at a 100% in-person gathering in Portland, Oregon.

The meeting was attended by 2,054 total delegates representing 40 countries. Those attending the meeting could choose from among 1,132 Interactive Talk presentations, 3 Focused Learning Sessions, 9 Hands-on Workshops, 3 Satellite Symposia, 39 Symposia and 3 Distinguished Lecture Series presentations. Delegates also had the opportunity to visit the exhibit hall, which had 47 booths



2023 AADOCR/ADEA/FNIDCR Advocacy Day



Delta Dental Institute has established the first national Oral Health Diversity Fund. In 2023, this industry-leading fund will make targeted investments of up to \$1 million in comprehensive solutions, innovative pilots, and scalable models that inspire school-aged children from historically underrepresented groups to pursue a career in oral health.

Delta Dental plans to invest in comprehensive solutions, innovative pilots, developed ideas, or proven, scalable models that address barriers that many historically underrepresented groups face in pursuing oral health careers.



In 2023, the Delta Dental Oral Health Diversity Fund will make targeted investments in programs designed to promote awareness and inspire school-aged children to pursue professional opportunities in oral health — including careers as dentists and all recognized dental specialties, oral health researchers, hygienists, and technicians.


Apply to the AADOCR MIND the Future Program

Each year AADOCR selects a cohort of ten mentees for the program, each of whom commits to at least one full year of mentoring education and activities.

Therapy for Rare Bone Disorder Shows Promise in NIH Clinical Trial

A clinical trial at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) found that a medication, denosumab, significantly reduced abnormal bone turnover in adults with fibrous dysplasia, a rare disease marked by weak and misshapen bones. Bone turnover, a process in which old bone is continuously replaced with new bone, is unusually accelerated in fibrous dysplasia and contributes to bone abnormalities. The study of eight participants was carried out by researchers from the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research (NIDCR) and the NIH Clinical Center. The results, which showed that denosumab may improve patients' quality of life by enabling healthy bone formation, were published as a correspondence report in the New England Journal of Medicine.

Celebrating Frederick S. McKay

In 1931, Dr. Frederick S. McKay discovered that high fluoride levels in the drinking water of the Colorado Springs area was causing not only brown enamel staining, but a higher resistance to tooth decay among the native inhabitants. This discovery sparked decades of subsequent research, eventually leading to the development of the fluoridation process. Today he is known as “The Father of Communal Fluoridation.”

McKay was born on this day, April 13th, in 1874.
